DOUBLE GRADUATION CEREMONY AT ZEPHYRHILLS (FL) CORRECTIONAL INSTITUTION



For the second time in the last two years, FIT has had the privilege of conducting a graduation ceremony at Zephyrhills Correctional for completion of its "100 hour" program. This involves the separate completions of at least six courses chosen from a list of eight. All these courses are facilitated in small-group format for maximum effectiveness. Participants are guided through the course materials while they learn to solve their own problems and relate to their Christian faith. Life issues that are covered include parenting, personal insight, decision-making from the Christian perspective, anger management, handling loss and grief, dating and marriage, and personal money management. FIT's "100 hour course" is approved by the Florida Department of Corrections as meeting

the requirements of the 100-hour transition course as mandated for every person leaving the state prison system.

Taking participants through the program one course at a time for two hours per week, as in this case, takes about a year. This shows how much just a few persons can accomplish over time. Though Ms. Weber and Rev. Campbell were responsible for most of the instruction over the past two years, this was a team effort. Without the help of the prison authorities, our volunteers, and our donors who supplied the materials, these graduations would have never taken place. Thank you to all who had a part. That is what FIT is all about. Other facilitators were Peter Ruggirello and Alyce Martinez.
